provide some **core**
functionality.

Organizations in OneTrust[®]...



[control permissions]

[rule viewing rights]

[define tenant separation]

[manage configuration scopes]

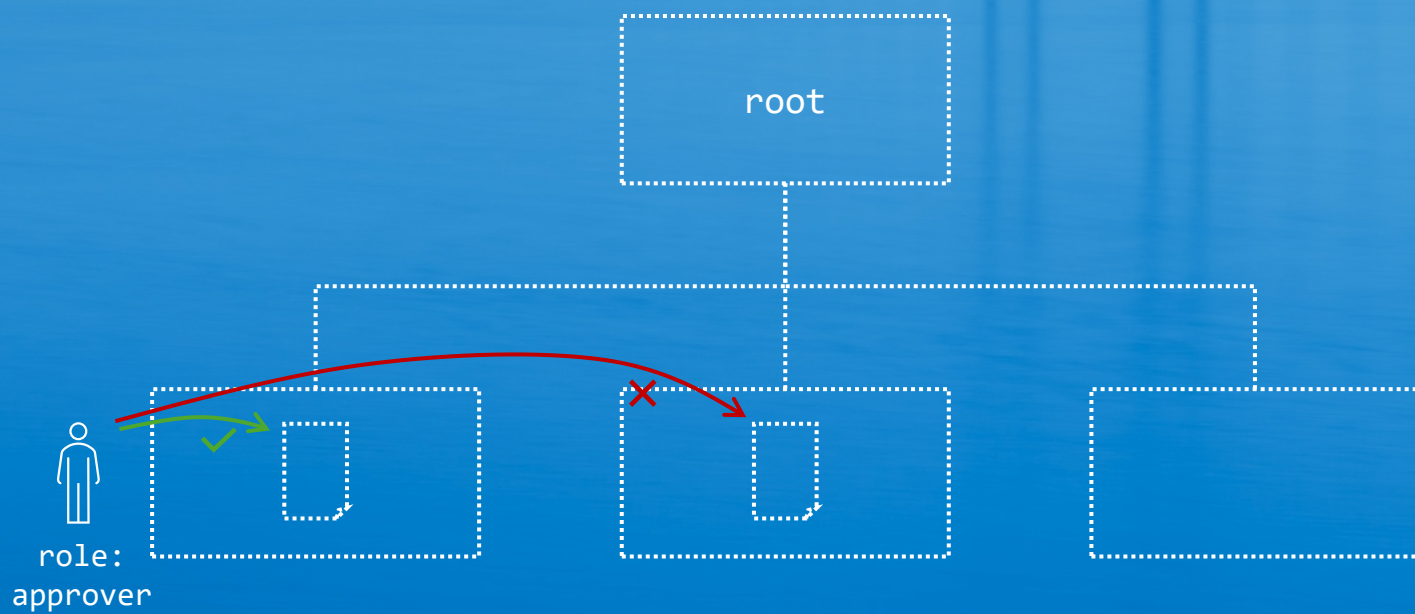
[govern default approvers]


[depict responsibility]

[can even be used as filters]



One of the most complex, but even most important and mighty concepts of OneTrust® is the interplay between roles and organization-based viewing rights.





By assigning users and data to nodes in the OneTrust[®] organizational tree, access can be controlled granularly – from “seeing it all” to “seeing nothing at all”.


But watch out!

Structure organizations carefully. Set up a **clear and distinct privacy structure** without getting lost in detail. Up to 4 levels should be sufficient.
